

SECTION A. Horticultural Specimens

Class 1 Hybrid Tea, Grandiflora, and their Climbing sports.
One bloom per stem, exhibition stage, No Singles. Eligible for Queen, King, Princess, Court(7) and ARS certificates.

Class 2 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Spray. Two or more blooms, exhibition stage.

Class 3 Hybrid Tea Open Bloom-
Fully open blooms with stamens showing

Class 4 Single Hybrid Tea or Spray-
One bloom per stem or spray with two or more blooms to a stem. A “Single” typically has four to eight petals.

Class 5 Single Floribunda Bloom.
One bloom per stem. A “Single” typically has four to eight petals.

Class 6 Floribunda. Exhibition form for variety, one bloom per stem. No singles

Class 7 Floribunda or Polyantha Sprays Two or more blooms, exhibition form for variety.

Class 8 Climbers (Designated as LCL,CL HT H. Giganteas and H. Wichuranas). One bloom per stem or spray with two or more blooms to a stem.

Class 9 Dowager Queen. Old Garden Roses or Species Roses, introduced prior to 1867, one bloom or spray with two or more blooms, naturally grown or disbudded. Year of introduction must appear on entry tag.

Class 10 Victorian Queen. Old Garden Rose or Species Rose, introduced in 1867 or later, or with unknown introduction date not fitting the qualifications for Class 9, naturally grown or disbudded, one bloom or spray with two or more blooms.

Class 11 Classic Shrubs(Classified by ARS as Hybrid Kordesii, Hybrid Moyesii, Hybrid Musk, Hybrid Rugosa). One bloom or spray with two or more blooms.

Class 12 Modern Shrubs. (classified as “S” by ARS). One bloom or spray with two or more blooms.

The “ Guidelines” stipulate that this class should be judged by the standards of its type, but that originality of the characteristics of the variety should be given extra consideration in the point scoring of the specimen. The variety’s originality or novelty should represent beauty that is different

than other roses in commerce, but should not be something “strange or ugly”. Point scoring for this class : Originality 20; form 20; color 20; substance 10; stem and foliage 5; balance and proportion 5; size 5; Total Points-100

SECTION B. Open Challenge Classes

Class 13 Novice Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora. One bloom per stem, Exhibition stage with no side growth.

Class 14 Floating Hybrid Tea. Exhibition form, no foliage, Bowls provided by the Rose Society.

Class 15 Floating Hybrid Tea. Fully Open, no foliage, fully open with stamens showing. Bowls provided by Rose Society.

Class 16 Picture Frame. Hybrid Tea, exhibition form, no foliage. Frames Provided by Rose Society. No Singles

Class 17 Hi-Lo. One Hybrid Tea and one miniature or mini flora, look-a-likes, one bloom per stem, exhibition form for variety. NO SINGLES

Class 18 Matched Pair. Two Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras same variety, one-bloom-per stem, exhibition stage for the variety, in separate vases.

Class 19 Three Stages. Three Hybrid Teas, same variety, different stages of bloom. BUD WITH FIRST ROW OF PETALS UNFURLING; EXHIBITION STAGE AND FULLY OPEN BLOOM. Displayed in separate vases.

Class 20 Three Hybrid Teas or Grandifloras. One bloom per stem, same varieties, exhibition stage, displayed in separate containers.

Class 21 Three Hybrid Teas or Grandiflors. One bloom per stem, different varieties, exhibition stage, displayed in separate containers.

Class 22 Artist’s Palette. Five Hybrid Teas, each a different variety and color class, Exhibition Stage. No Singles. Palettes provided by Rose Society.

Class 23. Six Hybrid Teas. One Bloom per stem, same variety, exhibition form, one container. CONTAINER FURNISHED BY EXHIBITOR.

Class 24 English Box. Six Hybrid Teas, one or more varieties, exhibition form, no foliage, but sepals allowed. No Singles

Class 25 Judges Challenge. One Hybrid Tea, exhibition form.

Class 26. Floating Floribunda, Climber or Shrub. Open bloom with Stamens showing.

SECTION C. MINIATURE/MINI FLORA SPECIMENS

Class 27. Miniatures and Their Climbing Sports. One bloom per stem, exhibition form. Eligible for Queen, King, Princess, Court(7) and ARS Certificates.

Class 28. Mini Floras. One bloom per stem, exhibition form. Eligible for Queen, King, Princess, Court(7) and ARS Certificates.

Class 29 Miniature or Mini Flora Spray. Spray with two more blooms per stem.

Class 30 Miniature. One fully open bloom. No Singles

Class 31 Mini Flora. One fully open bloom. No Singles

Class 32 Single Petaled Miniature. One bloom per stem “Singles” typically have four to eight petals.

SECTION D. MINIATURE/MINI FLORA CHALLENGE CLASSES

Class 33 Novice Miniature or Mini Flora. One bloom per stem, exhibition form

Class 34 Floating Miniature or Mini Flora. One bloom, exhibition stage, no foliage.

Class 35 Floating Miniature or Mini Flora. One bloom, fully open, no foliage.

Class 36 Picture Frame. One Miniature or Mini Flora, exhibition stage, no foliage.

Class 37 Miniature or Mini Flora Stages. Three miniatures in different stages of bloom (bud with first row of petals unfurling, exhibition bloom, bloom fully open) each in separate containers.

Class 38 Three miniatures or Mini Floras. One bloom per stem, same variety, exhibition stage, separate containers.

Class 39 Artist’s Palette. Five Miniatures or Mini Floras, exhibition stage, each a different Variety and color class. Palettes provided by the Rose Society.

Class 40 Miniature or Mini Flora English Box. Six miniatures or Mini Flora roses, one or more varieties with no foliage. Sepals allowed.

Class 41 Twelve Miniatures or Mini Floras. One bloom per stem, one or more varieties, SHOWN IN ONE CONTAINER FURNISHED BY EXHIBITOR.

Class 42 Judges Challenge. One Miniature or Mini Flora rose, one

bloom per stem, exhibition form. No Singles.

Class 43 Miniature or Mini Flora Matched Pair. Two roses, same variety, one bloom per stem, exhibition form, in separate containers. No Singles
